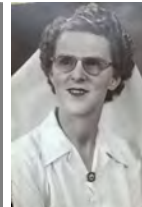

MOYNE HEALTH SERVICES HISTORY

- 1849 - Belfast Benevolent Society established
- 1851 - Atkinson made a donation of land for a building
- 1855 - Foundation Stone laid in Villiers Street
- 1873 - Local fundraising raised for two new wings
- 1875 - Extensions opened
- 1888- Stack Fever wards opened
- 1891 - Portion of the 1955 building converted to nurses quarters
- 1897 - Opening of the Victoria Ward
- 1908 - New Fever Ward opened
- 1934 - Lord and Lady Huntingfield opened new additions to the hospital
- 1945 - Penicillin used for the first time
- 1959 - Sir Dallas Brookes opened a new maternity wing
- 1965 - Sir Rohan Delacombe opened the Nurses home
- 1976 - Prime Minister The Hon Malcolm Fraser opened a new outpatient and casualty department with the new hospital ward block
- 1988 - The Hon Rob Knowles opened Belfast House
- 1988 - Establishment of Port Fairy Medical Clinic in partnership with the Sackville Clinic Medical Practitioners
- 2000 - The Port Fairy Hospital, Belfast House and Moyneyana House merged to become Moyne Health Services
- 2004 - Refurbishment of Day Centre building resulting in the relaunch of the building known today as Community Health
- 2005 - Completion of a 17 bed extension to Moyneyana House
- 2006 - Sir Ninian Stephen opened Moyneyana House
- 2010 - Last operating theatre list conducted and extension of Port Fairy Medical Clinic
- 2012 - MHS endorsed as the Committee of Management for the Koroit and District Memorial Hospital land and buildings
- 2017 – Premier, The Hon Daniel Andrews opened the new Community Health Building
- 2018 - Opening of the Urgent Care Centre by The Hon Jill Hennessy
- 2020 - MHS launches new brand and logo
- 2021 - Partial refurbishment of Moyneyana House completed
- 2022 - Previous Koroit and District Memorial Hospital demolished due to structural integrity being compromised
- 2023 - Dining Room furniture in Belfast House and Moyneyana House updated
